

An overview

Heidelberger Frühling Liedfestival 2024 – „Brahms and the Disorder of Lieder“

26 events from 8 to 16 June 2024

With its 3rd Liedfestival from 8 to 16 June 2024 under the motto “Brahms and the Disorder of Lieder”, the Heidelberger Frühling concludes its season focus on Johannes Brahms. The programme of 26 events includes recitals with singing greats such as sopranos Sarah Maria Sun or Erika Baikoff or baritone Florian Boesch as well as up-and-coming young singers such as baritone Konstantin Krimmel or tenor Tae Hwan Yun. In seven public masterclasses of the Heidelberger Frühling Liedakademie and a final concert, the audience can look over the shoulders of the scholars as they work with Artistic Director Thomas Hampson. The Lied.LAB at the Völkerkundemuseum Heidelberg and a musical museum tour at the Kurpfälzisches Museum Heidelberg will be experimental.

Like the Streichquartettfest in January and the Musikfestival in spring, the Liedfestival places Johannes Brahms centre stage and embeds his Lied oeuvre in larger contexts. The **motto “Brahms and the Disorder of Lieder”** refers to the composer's tendency not to compile larger Lied cycles, but to collect his Lieder in small “bouquets” – as he himself called them – which could be made up of settings of poets from different eras and without thematic connections. His admiration for the folk song can also be heard in several concerts.

In ten Lied recitals, Brahms' Lied works will be placed in a wide variety of contexts, often breaking up the classical combination of voice and piano.

On 8 June, **The Erlkings** will present Lied to the audience with a lot of charm and humour. The programme includes new arrangements of Brahms' Lieder, which they have added to their repertoire for the Liedfestival.

On 9 June, tenor **Tae Hwan Yun**, winner of the competition Heidelberger Frühling Wettbewerb “Das Lied” 2023, and his piano partner Matthias Alteheld will focus on Lied settings by poet Heinrich Heine. Soprano **Erika Baikoff** makes her debut in Heidelberg with Lieder from Joseph Haydn to Arnold Schönberg with pianist James Baillieu.

On 11 June, soprano **Katharina Konradi**, mezzo-soprano **Catriona Morison** and Ammiel Bushakevitz at the piano will bring German and French Lied culture into dialogue and also address the rivalry between the two vocal disciplines with duets by Brahms, among others.

On 12 June, soprano **Sarah Maria Sun**, known above all for her furious interpretations of contemporary music, will join pianist **Jan Philip Schulze** and clarinettist **Kilian Herold** to showcase the full diversity of Lied with works ranging from Schubert to Brahms and Bernstein to Ligeti.

On 13 June, baritone **Konstantin Krimmel**, one of the new great voices, and pianist **Ammiel Bushakevitz** will juxtapose Brahms and Liszt with Romanian Lieder by Brahms' friend and composer Eusebius Mandyczewski.

On 14 June, soprano **Theresa Pilsl** and baritone **Jonas Müller**, both alumni of the Liedakademie, will dedicate themselves to Brahms' Deutsche Volkslieder WoO 33 in an all-Brahms programme, not with piano accompaniment, but with **Leonard Becker** on guitar.

Mezzo-soprano **Ema Nikolovska**, also an alumna of the Liedakademie, will also bring a guitarist with her on this day: **Sean Shibe**, one of the most creative and exciting on his instrument and a recent Grammy nominee, will accompany her on classical and electric guitar in her programme „Orlando, der Zeitenwanderer“ (“Orlando, the time traveller”) with Lieder ranging from Jules Massenet and Bob Dylan to two commissioned compositions.

The focus of the concert on 15 June with the **trio tRiaLog**, consisting of mezzo-soprano Sarah Romberger, clarinettist Daniel Romberger and pianist Fil Liotis, is a composition commissioned by Heidelberger Frühling and the Kölner Philharmonie: composer Philipp Maintz (*1977) has set "liebeslieder", the sensual and melancholy nature poetry by writer Elisabeth Plessen (*1944), to music. On the same evening, mezzo-soprano **Patricia Nolz** and her former teacher baritone **Florian Boesch** will once again focus on Brahms duets and his folk songs with pianist **Andreas Fröschl**. The festival finale on 16 June will feature the scholars of the Heidelberger Frühling Liedakademie with their final concert of the year. The programme includes Lieder to texts from "Des Knaben Wunderhorn" by Achim von Arnim and Clemens Brentano, set to music by Johannes Brahms and others.

These scholars of the **Liedakademie** can also be experienced from 11 to 15 June in a total of seven public masterclasses with its **Artistic Director Thomas Hampson**. The masterclasses on 11 and 12 June will be **livestreamed**. The star baritone will also talk about the special features of Brahms' Lied compositions in his **lecture in German „Um der Liebe willen – Brahms als Liedkomponist“** ("For the sake of love – Brahms as a Lied composer") and will immerse the audience in recordings by outstanding interpreters of the last hundred years in the joint listening session "Thomas' Playlist".

The Heidelberger Frühling has once again commissioned a young artist to curate a **Lied.LAB** especially for the Liedfestival. Entitled **„Tierische Gefährten – fantastische Kreaturen“** ("Animal Companions – Fantastic Creatures"), it will take place at the Völkerkundemuseum Heidelberg, just like last year's Lied.LAB, and will be performed four times from 12 to 15 June. Inspired by the museum's current exhibition on animals and animal symbolism, Teodora Oprisor, Romanian-born pianist and alumna of the Liedakademie, will create an experimental format on animal subjects. During the walk through the exhibition rooms, which include dragons, phoenixes and sphinxes, the audience will encounter Maurice Ravel's "Histoires naturelles" and other works on the subject, interpreted by voice, pan flute, accordion and piano. Rooms of the museum that were previously not open to the public will also be used.

The musical museum tour **„Starke Frauenbilder – zarte Männerseelen“** ("Strong images of women – tender souls of men") on 9 June at the Kurpfälzisches Museum Heidelberg is also a special experience. In two groups, the public will explore depictions of men and women in Lied and painting with museum director Prof. Dr. Frieder Hepp and Dr. Julia Carrasco, head of the paintings and graphics collection. The approximately three-hour tour, consisting of short concerts and art-historical impulses, leads through all the rooms of the museum.

The Liedfestival is sponsored by the **Art Mentor Foundation Lucerne** and is a project of the **Heidelberger Frühling Liedzentrum**.

A Lied-filled walk through the rooms and gardens of Völkerkundemuseum of the Josefine and Eduard von Portheim Foundation. Performance without intermission

The collections of the Josefine and Eduard von Portheim Foundation's Völkerkundemuseum (Ethnological Museum) comprise around 40,000 objects, many of which have hardly ever been on display before. For the current exhibition on animals and animal symbolism with exhibits from almost every corner of the globe, museum director Alban von Stockhausen and his team of curators delved deep into the mezzanine floors and enchanted depots of the building on the eastern edge of Heidelberg's old town. The result is a lovingly staged show: Depictions of dragons, phoenixes, sphinxes and other fantastic and real creatures tell of how animal forms serve as a projection surface for human needs and characteristics. While some embody wild, untamed nature in fables, legends and symbols, others stand by humans as loyal companions and protectors. The animal kingdom has repeatedly made symbolic appearances not only in art and cult objects, but also in literature and music, for example in the famous fables of the Frenchman Jean de La Fontaine. Teodora Oprisor, the Romanian-born pianist and alumna of the Heidelberger Frühling Liedakademie, has now put together an original and amusing Lied.LAB on animal subjects. Maurice Ravel's exquisite "Histoires naturelles" for voice and piano, composed to poems by Jules Renard, is a small bestiary of humanity. Together with her excellent young colleagues, Oprisor takes us on an animalistic walk through the buildings of the Palais Weimar and its beautiful garden. The boundary between nature and culture is barely discernible ...

After the rush of visitors last year, the Lied.LAB is now taking place for the second time at Völkerkundemuseum.

Prominent alumni of the Liedakademie include baritone Benjamin Appl and sopranos Elsa Dreisig and Nadine Sierra.

At the Liedfestival 2024, the audience will take part in the final work phase of the current year of the Heidelberger Frühling Liedakademie in public masterclasses, a lecture and a listening session with Artistic Director Thomas Hampson and the final concert. It has set itself the goal of cultivating the heritage of Lied and ensuring its renewal at an excellent level. The Liedzentrum brings together the Liedakademie under the Artistic Direction of Thomas Hampson, the competition Heidelberger Frühling Wettbewerb "Das Lied" founded by Thomas Quasthoff and, since 2022, the Liedfestival. The Liedzentrum also implements other artistic projects such as interdisciplinary Lied.LABs, the short films of "Lied me!" or the CD release "Schumann – Alle Lieder" with Christian Gerhaher and Gerold Huber. Concert organisers and Lied creators come together in a "Lied Network" to discuss current issues.
